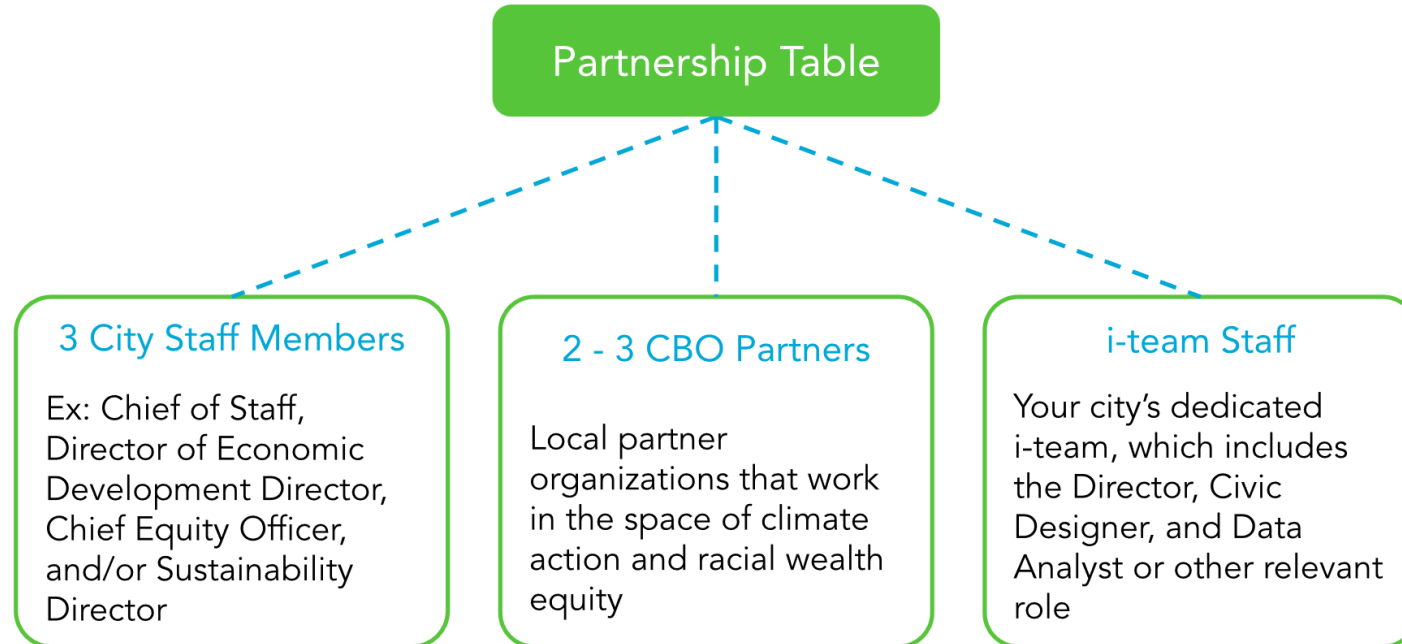

1



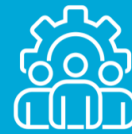
Position city staff and CBOs to shape the policies, projects, and practices developed through the initiative

Build the capacity of city staff and CBOs to lead work at the intersection of racial wealth equity and climate action

3



Resource CBOs to support their work to build/grow the relational infrastructure in cities, so that they are better positioned to solve problems in the future

4



Increase the capacity of city staff to develop, strengthen, and engage community partnerships

Progress to Date

During the last few months the City of Hampton and the iteam have done the folowing:

- Partnership Table communication
- Memphis City and Community Workshop
- Connecting i-team to City leadership



Funding Support

- \$120,000 grant to support the work of the i-team and city over the three years
- \$230K Implementation Grant to develop a Climate Action Plan with sustainability components (consultant)
- Technical assistance to apply for federal grants
- Additional opportunities for future grants
