









VDOT Project - Overview



VDOT Project – Property Ownership



VDOT & City Memorandum

- The VDOT project will impact the Park
 - Elements of the Park need to be removed from the VDOT ROW during Project construction
 - VDOT and the City want to improve coordination of how the Park functions in the VDOT ROW
- Establish understanding of costs to relocate, store, and redesign of any park elements
 - The City needs to determine any design changes required to replace park elements
 - Future Park plans guided by the interests and priorities of the neighborhood

- April 30th Neighborhood Walk & Park Tour
- June Established MOA with VDOT
- June 21st Pasture Point Neighborhood Association (PPNA) Meeting
- July 20th Convened Steering Group, planning process
- August 2nd Reviewed site & develop survey questions
- August 16th Update at PPNA meeting
- September 14th Reviewed survey results & discussed priorities
- September 22-23rd VDOT Public Hearings
- October 12th Refined options
- November 9th Finalized recommendation



River Street Park Redesign Priorities

Southern Entrance Plaza:

- a) Close the City portion of the plaza during construction
- b) Preserve decorative fencing, landscaping and trees, and the entryway signage located on City property
- c) Redesign plaza pattern, if needed

River Street Park Redesign Priorities

Under the Freeway:

- a) Replace compasses & history walk
 - Incorporate into the redesigned plaza, or
 - Relocate to another location within the neighborhood
- b) Preserve pedestrian bulkhead pathway and replace benches (May require ADA enhancements)
- c) Allow path to loop between the pylons
- d) Ensure use of low maintenance landscaping and materials.
- e) Limit the use of chain-link fencing
- f) Replace decorative fencing along River Street
- g) Remove the parking spaces under the freeway

River Street Park Redesign Priorities

Northside Waterfront

Three options to be explored with VDOT (by priority):

- a) Reinstall the boat launch, along with replacement parking on potential VDOT surplus property (including parking), or
- b) Relocate to another site in the neighborhood, or
- c) Reinvest in an existing pier on the Hampton River (e.g. Mill Point)

Spring-Summer 2022
 Park redesign & begin permitting process

Fall 2022
 Park closes for construction
