





2020 Regional Part 1 Crime Violent & Property




2020 Regional Violent Crime Rate Per 1,000 Population



Part-I Offense 5 Year Comparison Years 2016-2020




City of Hampton Part-1 Offense 5 Year Comparison January 1 - December 31: 2016 -2020

Part-I Property Offenses 5 Year Comparison January 1 – December 31: 2016-2020




Victim Data by Age Group

Operation Safe Hampton

- Time Frame
 - Initial Phase: Operation Dates Will Be Re-evaluated Periodically
- Two Community Response Teams
 - Made Up of Various Units Throughout The Division
 - One Wythe & One Chesapeake
 - Professionally Proactive In Keeping With The 4th Pillar of the 21st Century Policing Model (Community Policing & Crime Reduction)
 - Focus
 - Guns, Gangs, Drugs
 - Violent Crime Hot Spots
 - Known Violent Offenders
- Operations -
 - Increase Proactivity and Traffic Enforcement
 - Conduct Warrant Service in Assigned Districts



Operation Safe Hampton

- Warrant Unit
 - Service of Violent Felony Warrants
- Community Engagement Unit
 - Conduct Door to Door Visits
 - In Neighborhoods that have experienced gun violence
 - Utilize the Mobile Command Vehicle
 - Discuss the Operation
 - Seek Information on Criminal Activity in the Neighborhood

Public Information Office

- Release a Press Release and Social Media
 Campaign about the Operation
- Obtain Public Buy-In

Real Time Information Center (RTIC)

- The RTIC remains a powerful example of the 3rd Pillar (Technology & Social Media) and the 4th Pillar (Community Policing and Crime Reduction) of the 21st Century Policing Model
- "Virtual Responses" have increased and assisted in numerous recent investigations
 - Our citizens continue to be a huge help to us in the detection and solving of crime. Their Ring cameras make their assistance even more valuable.
 - Allowing us to better understand methodology that suspects are using when committing crime



Real Time Information Center (RTIC)

- Recent case using multiple analysts monitoring suspect actions that led to their apprehension
- Investigative assistance in many traffic accidents
- Recent robbery case was able to be unfounded due to events that unfolded and were discovered by our analysts
- RTIC will have extra analysts working to support Operation Safe Hampton
 - This team will consist of civilian analysts and sworn officers monitoring our Community Response Teams, events unfolding around them and throughout the city.
