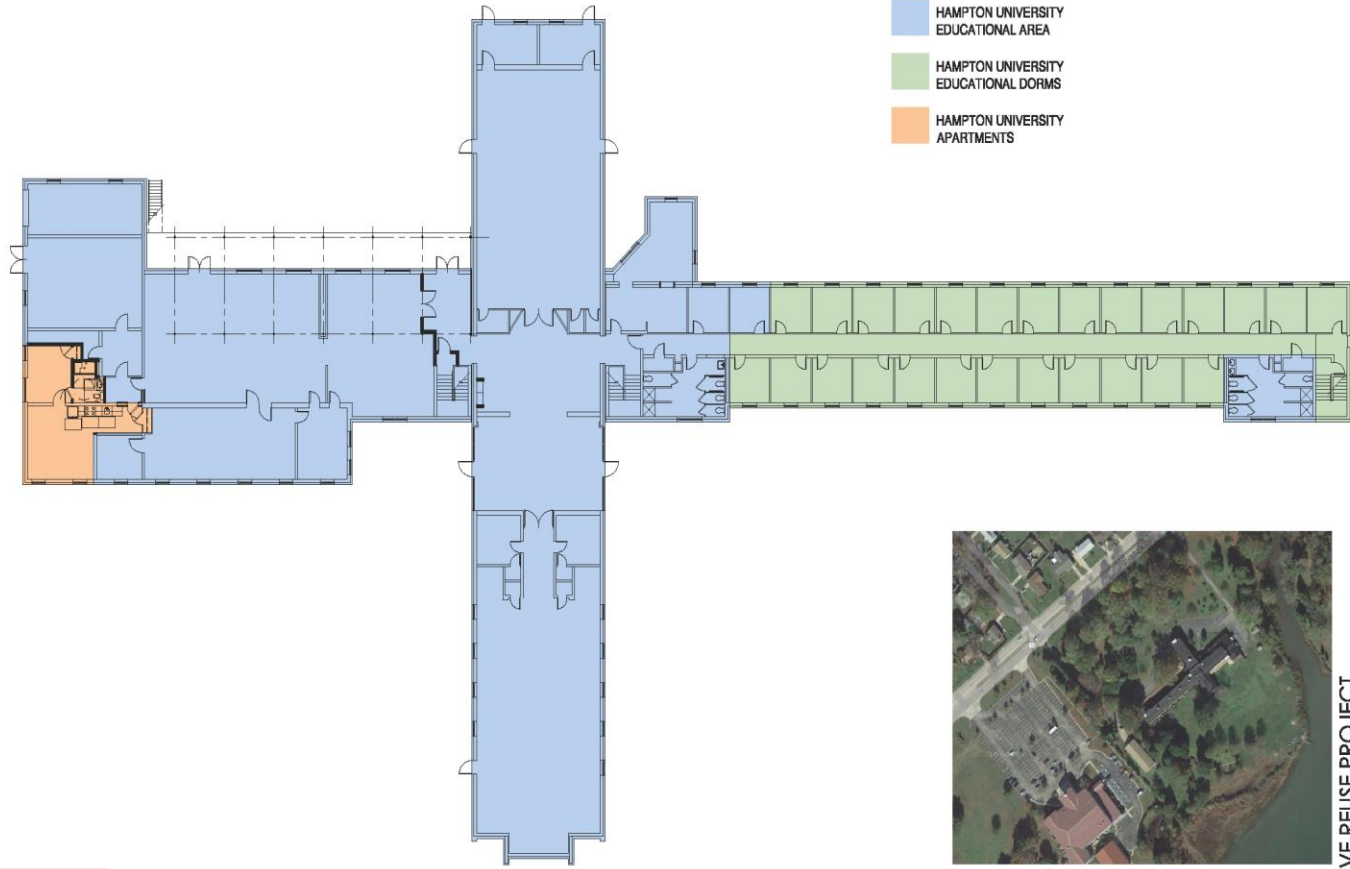

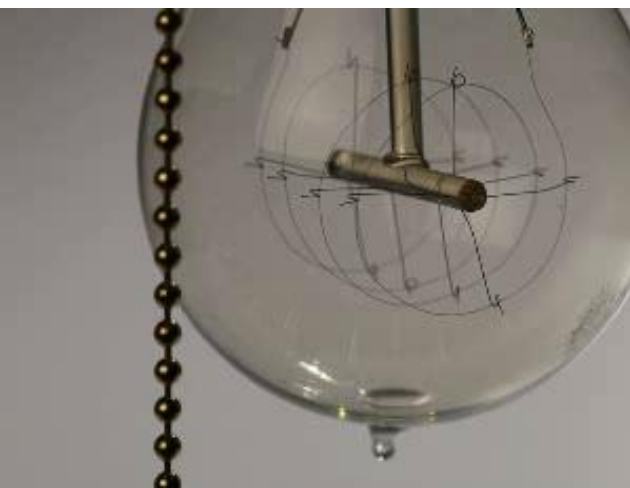


Hampton University is a comprehensive institution of higher education dedicated to the promotion of learning, building character and preparing promising students for positions of leadership and service.

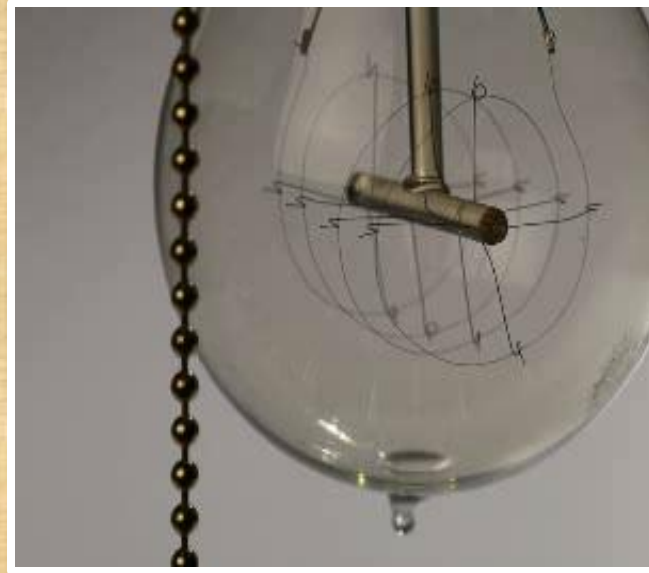

## **Program Vision**

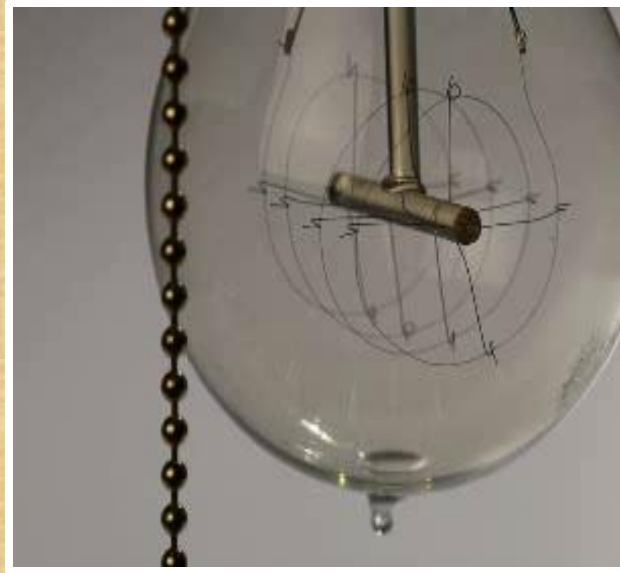
To provide traditional and non-traditional instructional delivery systems of theological education through formal accredited programs of study and practical applicable curricula.

## Program Objectives

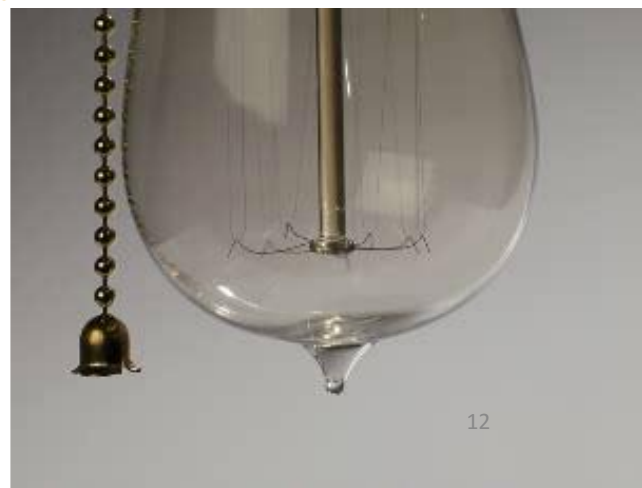
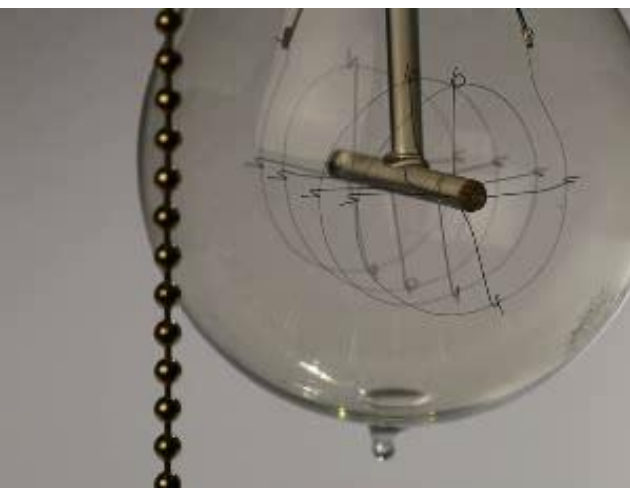
- To broaden and deepen knowledge of religion, theology and philosophy.
