STAFFING ANALYSIS: HAMPTON'S POSITIONS PER DEPARTMENT COMPARED WITH THOSE IN THE REGION

A staffing analysis was performed by comparing the number of positions per capita reported in the budget document of city departments in the region. The cities included Chesapeake, Newport News, Norfolk, Portsmouth, and Virginia Beach. The chart shows how Hampton compares with the region's average, and with just Newport News. The positive numbers indicate the number of positions for Hampton to add to be equivalent and negative numbers reflect where Hampton appears to be adequately staffed. These results are just one tool to assess staffing levels, and are not complete without a more detailed analysis which includes other factors, such as priority level, service levels, use of outside contractors, citizen needs within a community, etc. This analysis does not include positions that are driven by the state (such as those in the Sheriff's Office, Social Services, Clerk of Courts, etc.).
