conditions for a nursing home;

WHEREAS: the applicant is proposing a memory care facility, providing 20

bedrooms with private bathrooms, a central living space, kitchen and dining area, an office, and two (2) staff bathrooms in a single

story building;

WHEREAS: provided site amenities would include landscaped garden areas

with paved walking paths, private lawns, and bench seating within

secured fencing;

WHEREAS: the <u>Hampton Community Plan</u> (2006, as amended) recommends

recommends low density residential use for the subject property;

WHEREAS: the applicant has proffered nine (9) conditions to include limiting the

land use to nursing home, substantial conformance with the concept plan, substantial conformance with the elevations, and

requirements related to fencing the dumpster enclosure screening;

**WHEREAS:** MD-4 requires an approved use permit for the nursing home use;

WHEREAS: this application is in conjunction with Use Permit Application No. 24-

0432 to allow the nursing home use;

WHEREAS: Commissioners asked questions regarding the operational aspects

of the proposal that included on-site amenities and security measures, as well as the relationship between the franchisor,

Beehive Homes, and the franchisee, the applicant;

WHEREAS: City staff recommends approval of this rezoning application; and

WHEREAS: three (3) persons from the public spoke to this application. One (1)

in support and the other two (2) had questions regarding the

proposed operation.
