# CERTIFICATIONS REGARDING LOBBYING; DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS; AND DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should refer to the regulations cited below to determine the certification to which they are required to attest. Applicants should also review the instructions for certification included in the regulations before completing this form, Signature of this form provides for compliance with certification requirements under 28 CFR Part 69. # 2. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBIUTY MATTERS (DIRECT RECIPIENT)

As required by Executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension, and Implemented at 28 CFR Part 67, for prospective participants in primary covered transactions, as defined at 28 CFR Part 67, Section 67.510

- A. The applicant certifies that it and its principals:
