Resilient Hampton Initiative | Downtown Hampton, Phoebus & Buckroe Design Workshop

PURPOSE

Building upon Phase I of Resilient Hampton and the Newmarket Creek Water Plan, completed in 2021, the Downtown Hampton, Phoebus, and Buckroe Water Plan will be a strategic plan for the future resiliency of these Hampton neighborhoods, organized around watersheds, rivers, and shorelines. Working at multiple scales – from watershed, to district, to neighborhood, to parcel – the plan will identify, prioritize, and recommend project opportunities aligned with Resilient Hampton's values, goals, and guiding principles.

Waggonner & Ball, working together with the City of Hampton, has identified and synthesized local conditions, ongoing urban and infrastructure planning and development efforts, and community input on assets and challenges in these areas of the City. During this design workshop, working together with key stakeholders and the community, the team will identify strategic approaches to resilient design to implement in the study areas, and develop initial project concepts to present in the final plan.
