# **MAYOR'S COMMENTS**

Mayor Tuck announced that the applicant on item #24-0278 had withdrawn their rezoning application so that matter is being removed from the agenda.

The following Hampton City Schools students were recognized for having their artwork featured on the City's holiday cards: Bethel High School - Dayla Philman, Kecoughtan High School - Aliyah Boyce, Hampton High School - Angela Chen and James Sidebottom, and Phoebus High School - Nakia Boykin.

Mayor Tuck read and presented a letter to Johnny Sain,

nephew, and Gary Macklin, long-time employee and friend recognizing the many contributions of Clark's Feed Store.

Councilwoman Harper shared a plaque that Hampton received for placing 10th in Digital Cities. She picked up the award during the National League of Cities gathering in Tampa, Florida in November.

Mayor Tuck introduced Bill Mullis, the owner of Larry King Law Langley Speedway. Mr. Mullis thanked the city for a wonderful partnership and showed a video highlighting the speedway.

Mayor Tuck shared that Hampton earned a perfect score of 100 on the 2024 Municipal Equality Index demonstrating how inclusive our laws, policies, and services are to the LGBTQ+ community.

Mayor Tuck also congratulated Phoebus High School's football team as they travel to Lynchburg this weekend to the State Class 4 Finals championship game and stated that we're hoping for a 4-peat.

He also announced that today Hampton was notified by the Environmental Protection Agency that it has been awarded over \$20 million that will be used in the Aberdeen Gardens neighborhood to create a sustainable, resilient future by addressing immediate flooding challenges and fostering economic growth through targeted green infrastructure, community engagement, and workforce development.
