








Reported Sexual Assaults Where Victim Knew Offender January 1-June 30, 2025





Reported Robberies By Charge Description January 1-June 30, 2025








Motor Vehicle Theft Analysis: By Vehicle Make January 1- June 30, 2025

- Requires swift, fair and just consequences for those who do harm in our community.






