existing building;

WHEREAS: the applicant is proposing to offer a variety of healthcare training

courses, such as personal care aide trainings, medication aide courses, medication administration aide trainings for childcare

providers, CPR/AED courses, and first aid classes;

WHEREAS: the subject property is zoned Phoebus Business District (PH-1), which

allows for private schools with an approved use permit;

WHEREAS: the <u>Hampton Community Plan</u> (2006, as amended) recommends

mixed-use for this area;

WHEREAS: the Hampton Community Plan includes economic development

objectives to attract and retain businesses and nurture small and

start-up businesses;

WHEREAS: the Hampton Community Plan also indicates the importance of

maintaining an educated and competitive workforce through close coordination among key institutions, including employment and

training agencies;

WHEREAS: there are seven (7) conditions proposed to be attached to this use

permit application based on the proposed use's operational characteristics and location, including, among other things, restricting the use to inside the building, a capacity condition limiting the school to no more than 33 occupants or the maximum capacity

determined by a City building official, whichever is lower; and

WHEREAS: no one from the public spoke for or against this proposal.

by Commissioner Carole Garrison,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Hampton Planning Commission recommends to City

Council approval of Use Permit Application No. 18-00009 with seven
