

AT A PUBLIC HEARING IN A REGULAR MEETING OF THE HAMPTON PLANNING COMMISSION HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL, HAMPTON, VIRGINIA, ON THURSDAY, JUNE 21, 2018 AT 3:30 P.M.

WHEREAS: the Hampton Planning Commission has before it this day a request to amend the Hampton Community Plan (2006, as amended) to update several sections of the Community Plan to reflect the City's commitment to resiliency;

WHEREAS: the amendment is based on the work in the Phase I Resilient Hampton report *Living with Water: A Holistic Approach to Addressing Sea Level Rise* that was endorsed by City Council in January 2018;

WHEREAS: Resilient Hampton is an initiative to build on Hampton's existing assets and community in order to be able to recover faster from extreme events and relieve chronic stresses associated with recurring flooding and sea level rise;

WHEREAS: adoption of this amendment would formally incorporate the Phase I work into official guiding policy for land use development;

WHEREAS: amended sections of the Hampton Community Plan include Visions and Goals; existing land use conditions, anticipated future land use conditions, and land use policies in Land Use and Community Design; natural hazards, flood control, and anticipated future conditions in Environmental Stewardship; and policies in Housing and Neighborhoods, Community Facilities and Transportation;

WHEREAS: this amendment satisfies the requirement under section 15.2-2223.3 of the Code of Virginia to incorporate strategies to combat sea-level rise and recurrent flooding into the comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS: no members of the public spoke for or against this proposal.


NOW, THEREFORE, on a motion by Commissioner Trina Coleman and seconded by Commissioner Carole Garrison,
