- ☐ Population over Age 65 % = 14.5%















Median Household Income (state/county) (1997 - 2018)

Housing Issues in Hampton

"Housing Problems" according to HUD are:

- Substandard Housing: Lacking complete plumbing or kitchen facilities
- ☐ Severely Overcrowded: >1.51 people per room
- Overcrowded: 1.01-1.5 people per room
- ☐ **Housing Cost Burden:** >50% of income
- ☐ **Housing Cost Burden:** >30% of income

(A household is considered to have a "housing problem" if they have one or more of the problems)







Hampton Housing Age




