

## Settlers Landing Roadway Improvements


- Public Works conducted traffic a study in February 2024, recommending enforcement of the 25 mph speed limit, adding no turn on red signage throughout corridor and lengthening pedestrian signal times.
- City of Hampton Public Works Department and Downtown Hampton Development
  Partnership engaged consultants Guernsey Tingle and Kimley- Horn to develop concept
  plans which would incorporate traffic calming, pedestrian safety and align with Council
  strategic priority areas and placemaking.

## **Proposed-Eaton Street**



- Entryway Hampton Wave Arch
- Eliminate on-street parking between Eaton Street and Wine Street "southside only"
- Protected multi-use path
- Vegetated median strips
- Extended Sidewalks
- Extended bump-outs to shorten crossing distances from 70 to 50 feet

- Raised street to curb level for entire block between Wine Street and King Street
- Lighted protective bollards
- Eliminate on-street parking for the northside of block
- Protected multi-use paths
- Extended Sidewalks
- 7- Hampton Wave Arches
- Concrete foundations used as seating area

- Extended bump-outs to shorten crossing distance from 70 to 50 feet

## **Overview and Next Steps**

#### **Safety Improvements Incorporated:**

- Extending sidewalks
- Narrowing vehicular travel lanes
- Extending bump-outs at pedestrian crossings to reducing crossings from 70 to 50 feet, shortening crossing times by 6 seconds
- ADA curb ramps allowing mobility aids to move freely throughout the area
- Raised Crosswalks
- Multi-use path with protective buffer
