




Revenue Sharing Overview

- Program is defined in Section 33.2-357 of the Code of Virginia
- Two year application process: FY19 and FY20
- Tentative statewide allocation for each year is \$100 million
- Provides matching allocation up to \$5 million for projects designated by the locality for improvement, construction, or reconstruction with up to \$5 million for maintenance projects
- Projects are prioritized, with construction projects considered the top priority and then maintenance projects
- Application for program funding must be made by resolution of the governing body
- If approved, projects will be included in the next VDOT SYIP

Identifying Candidate Projects

- Ongoing projects that need additional funding to complete
- Construction and Maintenance projects that are in the City's adopted FY2018-2022 CIP Plan that are to be funded in FY2019 with City funds
- New projects that fit Revenue Sharing Program criteria that have been identified since approval of City's CIP

FY19 Candidate Projects

- Identified two (2) candidate projects
- Both are existing Revenue Sharing Program projects in need of additional funding

Total additional project costs: \$1.6M

Revenue Sharing: \$800K

City Match: \$800K

TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP)

Program authorized in federal transportation bill > Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21)

Funding = 80% Federal + 20% Local

Uses = bike & pedestrian facilities, trail facilities, construction of overlooks, etc.

Application for program funding must be made by resolution of the governing body






Figure 23: Overall Recommendations

ACTIONS REQUESTED

Adopt resolution support request for VDOT FY19 Revenue Sharing Program Funds for two (2) projects.

City match in FY19 = \$800,000

Applications due to VDOT by November 1, 2017

Adopt resolution supporting request for VDOT Transportation Allernatives Program Funds for seven (7) projects.

City match FY20 projects = \$860,000

Applications due to VDOT by November 1, 2017
