At every regular meeting of the council, the order of business shall be as 10 11 follows: (1) 12 13 Call of the roll. (2) 14 15 Invocation/Pledge of allegiance. 16 (3)17 Consent agenda for the meeting, as prepared by the clerk of the council and to include consideration of the minutes of the previous 18 meeting, ordinances believed to be routine and noncontroversial, 19 and any other items believed by the clerk of the council to be 20 routine and not controversial in nature; provided that, a member of 21 the council may, by request, have any item moved from the consent 22 agenda to the regular business agenda. Removal of an item from 23 24 the consent agenda by an individual council member shall require twenty-four (24) hours notice to the city manager, city attorney or 25 clerk of council, or the concurrence of three council members at the 26 meeting. The consent agenda shall be approved in toto by motion 27 and roll call vote. 28 29 (4) Presentations, proclamations and awards. 30 (5)31 Regular business agenda, as prepared by the clerk of the council and 32 to include all public hearing items and general business items of 33 which he has been notified by any of the following persons: the 34 35 mayor, at least three (3) concurring members of council, the city 36 manager or the city attorney by 12:00 p.m. on each Friday following the second Wednesday each month, (i.e., the "regular meeting" 37 agenda deadline"). Items submitted after the regular meeting

agenda deadline for any given meeting shall be included on the

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regular agenda only with the approval of the city manager. 40 Members of the general public recognized to speak at public 41 hearings on the regular business agenda or to speak to other 42 matters on the regular business agenda shall be allotted three (3) 43 minutes speaking time, and shall only be permitted to use the city 44 audio-visual equipment during their allotted speaking period after 45 submission of the material to be displayed to the office of the clerk 46 for virus screening and software compatibility no less than two (2) 47 business days prior to the scheduled meeting. 48 49 *(6)* 50 Public comment. Members of the general public who have signed 51 up to speak outside the public hearings on the regular business 52 53 agenda on matters of public concern shall be allotted three (3) minutes speaking time without regard to any attempt by others to 54 yield time to the speaker. Persons recognized to speak shall only 55 56 be permitted to use the city audio-visual equipment during their allotted speaking period after submission of the material to be 57 displayed to the office of the clerk for virus screening and software 58 59 compatibility no less than two (2) business days prior to the scheduled meeting. 60 61 62 (6)(7)Reports by city manager, city council, staff or committees. 63 64 65 (7) <u>(8)</u> Miscellaneous new business, to include and be limited to the 66 opportunity for members of the council, the city manager and the 67 city attorney to be heard concerning matters relating to the 68 business of the city: No initiative requiring a vote by council, except 69 70 when subject to a specific time constraint or determined to be an emergency by a majority vote of council, shall be presented on the 71 floor by a council member under new business. 72 (8) (9) 73 Such order of business shall not be departed from except by the 74 consent of four (4) members of the council. 75 (9) 76 Public comment. Effective September 1, 2014, members of the general 77 public who have signed up to speak outside the public hearings on 78 79 the regular business agenda on matters of public concern shall be

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
