

Background

- Infrastructure development and maintenance are vital elements that impact various City Council strategic priority areas:
 - Excellence in Government accomplishments include projects that improve and maintain City infrastructure and equipment to include facilities, street maintenance, fleet services, etc.
 - Living with Water accomplishments include projects that reduce flooding and improve waterways such as stormwater management, dredging, etc.
 - Safe & Clean accomplishments include projects that promote a safe, clean, and healthy City such as solid waste collection, litter cleanup, wastewater, traffic management, storm preparation, etc.
 - Placemaking accomplishments include projects that enhance the sense of place in the City, such as new neighborhood center construction, etc.



Facilities Maintenance

- Completed over 3,600 work requests
- Upgraded over 1,400 existing fluorescent lighting fixtures with LED fixtures/bulbs (Annual energy savings of \$35,000)
- Replaced 20 HVAC systems that were at the end of their service life
- Remodeled North Hampton Library,17 office spaces and 2 conference rooms (lighting, paint, new carpet, and plumbing)
- Replaced over 150,000 square feet of flooring city wide
- Cleaned HVAC ducting in all 10 Fire Stations
- Installed Building Automation Systems at the American Theater and the Jail Annex
- Replaced approximately 175 Plumbing fixtures
- Replaced over 300 feet of water lines
- Replaced 17 hot water heaters

Fleet Services

Manage and maintain vehicles and equipment for City departments and agencies.

- Completed 5,200 service requests
- Responded to 520 off-site service calls
- Completed 460 walk-in service repairs
- Processed over 1.1 million gallons of fuel
- Activated 81 new vehicles and equipment





Fleet Services

Purchased 6 ambulance's, totaling over \$2.3 million dollars









Solid Waste Operations

Provides solid waste collection and disposal services to all residential customers in Hampton:

Approximately 123K collections a week or 6.4 million collections per year (Refuse, Recycle, and Bulk)

- 43,200 tons of household waste
- Over 4,700 tons of recycling
- Over 4,400 tons of yard waste





Hampton NASA Steam Plant

Provides solid waste disposal for the City of Hampton, and energy for NASA/Langley Research Center

- Reduced waste going to the Bethel landfill by 70%
- Processed over 30,000 tons of refuse
- Generating 150 million pounds of steam for NASA/Langley facility
- Replaced and Upgraded Plant Cooling Tower, Conveyors, Induced Draft Fan, numerous enhancements to the boiler equipment, and began the replacing Overhead Bridge Cranes









Clean City

Provides environmental education and public outreach events to maintain Hampton as a clean and beautiful City

- 11 tons of trash has been collected by Public Works Staff during April's Walk Hampton Clean city-wide clean up event.
- 3,390 citizen volunteers were engaged in 395 environmental cleanups, presentations, tours, workshops, webinars, social media, public outreach and monthly news letters
- 7,600 volunteer hours resulted in a \$258,477 savings to the City of Hampton







Stormwater Operations Division

Stormwater Operations cleaned and maintained over two million feet of infrastructure

- 1,400,000 feet of rear ditches cut/cleaned
- 1,300,000 feet of main outfall ditches maintenance
- 32,000 feet of street side ditches cleaned/rehabilitated

Stormwater improvement projects on Salters Creek Road ,North Campus Parkway, and Pennsylvania Avenue







Entomology Services

- 340 mosquito traps set (30,000 mosquitoes)
- Tested 56 mosquito samples for disease
- 580,000 feet of herbicide sprayed
- 500,000 feet of aquatic habitats treated for mosquitoes
- 1000 Red Imported Fire Ant (RIFA) colonies treated







Streets & Bridges Operations

Maintenance and repair of all City-owned streets and bridges

- 37,000 tons of asphalt roadway resurfaced
- 1,900 linear feet of curb, gutter & sidewalks repaired
- 1,700 potholes repaired
- 4,200 miles of streets swept



Traffic Operations

- Completed 956 Signal Equipment Repairs and Replacements
- Replaced over 380,000 Linear Feet of Thermoplastic Pavement Markings
- Replaced and Repaired over 4,400 Roadway Signs Citywide
- Completed approximately 2,150 Dominion work orders for Streetlights upgrades







Traffic Operations

- Signal Detection Upgrades at various locations
- Performed over 78 traffic studies in effort to reduce speeding
- Upgraded and replaced 75 Signal Cabinets
- Continued Repair and replacement of guardrails throughout the city







Maintains the City's wastewater system:


- Cleaned and inspected 400,000 feet of wastewater infrastructure
- Installed over 40,000 feet of Cured In-Place Pipe lining
- Manhole rehabilitation of 200 structures



Summer Storm Preparedness

- Public Works, Parks Recreation & Leisure Services and Hampton Police Department employees trained and prepared for summer storm response
- 100-plus vehicles and equipment apparatus are prepared to clear roadways
- Rapid response to tidal & storm related flooding issues







Public Works Winter Storm Preparedness

- Rapid response to snow and ice related events
- Cleared approximately 1800 lane miles of roadway across repeated winter weather events
- 1,100 tons of Salt used for anticing and deicing measures for winter storm response







Training & Orientation

- Registered Training Provider for Commercial Driver's License (CDL)
 - 27 employees obtained their Class B CDL
 - 2 employees obtained their Class A CDL
- Heavy Equipment Training Simulator
 - Trained Public Works, Hampton City Schools, and Interns
- New Virtual Reality Training
 - Increases retention and successful completion for CDL training



- 8 Hampton centers (4 community, 4 neighborhood) offer programs for all ages including open gym, fitness, afterschool enrichment, and family events.
- Support citywide initiatives like Recreation Matters, and Teen Engagement Programs.
- Serve critical roles as feeding sites and warming/cooling centers, ensuring residents have safe, supportive spaces year-round.



Specialty Centers

We ensure our services reach residents of all ages and abilities, offering inclusive programs and community connection.

Senior Center

- 13,115 Visitors in 2025
- 12 Weekly Programs
- 230 engaged in Senior Center Advisory Meetings

Therapeutic Recreation Center

- Over 6,000 Attendees Served





- -Interior work includes paint/flooring, furniture replacements, and update space plan.




Buckroe Beach Observation Pier Updates

River Street Park-


Developing a conceptual plan to restore a key neighborhood amenity that was disrupted by the VDOT bridge expansion.
