### Hampton Public Art Program

#### Goal:

To cultivate a fun, vibrant, and creative community by implementing a multiple pathway approach that supports and expands the creation of public art throughout the City.

- Available Funds: \$250,000
- \$100,000 allocated annually, Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)












#### Public Art Guidance

- Commission on the Arts June 2025
  - Recommend public art theme and locations
  - Locations to consider: Buckroe Beach, Phoebus Library, Downtown Hampton/Hampton University, and Virginia Peninsula Community College corporate area
- City Council July 2025
  - Statement pieces powerful, attention grabbing, impactful
  - Consider the Arts Districts Downtown and Phoebus
  - Start before the winter, if possible




# Public Art Theme











#### Theme Considerations

- Reflect who we are as a city a welcoming community shaped by water, people, history, and shared experiences.
- Embrace the beauty of our waterfront, the richness of our history, the diversity of our people, and the significance of our landmarks
- Highlight our deep ties to the water, the communities it sustains, and the stories it carries through time
- Showcase a city surrounded by water, rooted in fishing and boating traditions, and distinguished by our legacy of exploration and innovation



## **Proposed Theme**

From the Sea to the Stars: Past, Present, Possible

- Ensures cohesion and connectivity between the public art commissioned
- Offers a broad, unifying vision that artists can interpret in their own unique ways
- Encourages storytelling though vibrant, dynamic works that reflect Hampton's identify

#### **Locations Considered**

- Buckroe Beach
- Phoebus
- Downtown Hampton
- Downtown Hampton @ Hampton University
- Other Key Gateways:
  - Neil Armstrong Parkway VPCC area
  - Mercury Boulevard at City Line/Newmarket
  - Mercury Boulevard at Coliseum Drive
  - I-64 at Rip Rap Road











#### **Location Selection Process**

- Reviewed maps highlighting City-owned sites
- Received updates from staff on current and upcoming initiatives
- Identified opportunities to complement and amplify other improvements
- Focused on sites that foster community connection in addition to beautifying public spaces
- Evaluated locations where public art would create the greatest impact



### Proposed Location - Downtown Hampton

#### Site 1: Settlers Landing Parking Garage

Located near the Hampton History Museum and the Virginia Air & Space Science Center, this site offers opportunities for exterior murals as well as creative treatments in the interior stairwells











# Proposed Location - Downtown Hampton

Site 2: Queens Way (between Kings Way and Wine Street)

A pedestrian-only corridor at the heart of Downtown, Queens Way serves as a hub for events, festivals, and community activity. This site is ideal for sculptural or installation-based artworks that animate the space and invite interaction.



#### Future Public Art Sites

- Phoebus
  - Intersection of County & Mallory Street (asphalt art)
  - Intersection of E. Mellen & Mallory Street (asphalt art)
  - Intersection of E. Mellen & S. Hope Street (asphalt art)
  - Walkway between Lancer Street parking lot and County Street parking lot (sculpture or installation)
- Site visible from Interstate-64

### Request for Proposals (RFP)

- Required for projects over \$30,000
- Consistent with the Commission on the Arts Process for Solicited and Unsolicited Public Art Proposals
- Scope includes:
  - Location and Theme
  - Size/Medium
  - Project Cost
  - Ownership and Copyright
  - Submission Requirements
  - Selection Criteria and Award Considerations
  - Timeline Spring 2026



### **Public Art Selection Panel**

- City staff representation
- Members of Commission on the Arts/Public Art Sub-Committee
- Art Professionals
- Area Stakeholders Will vary based on the area selected
  - Neighborhood Commission District Representative
  - Downtown Hampton Development Partnership Representative
