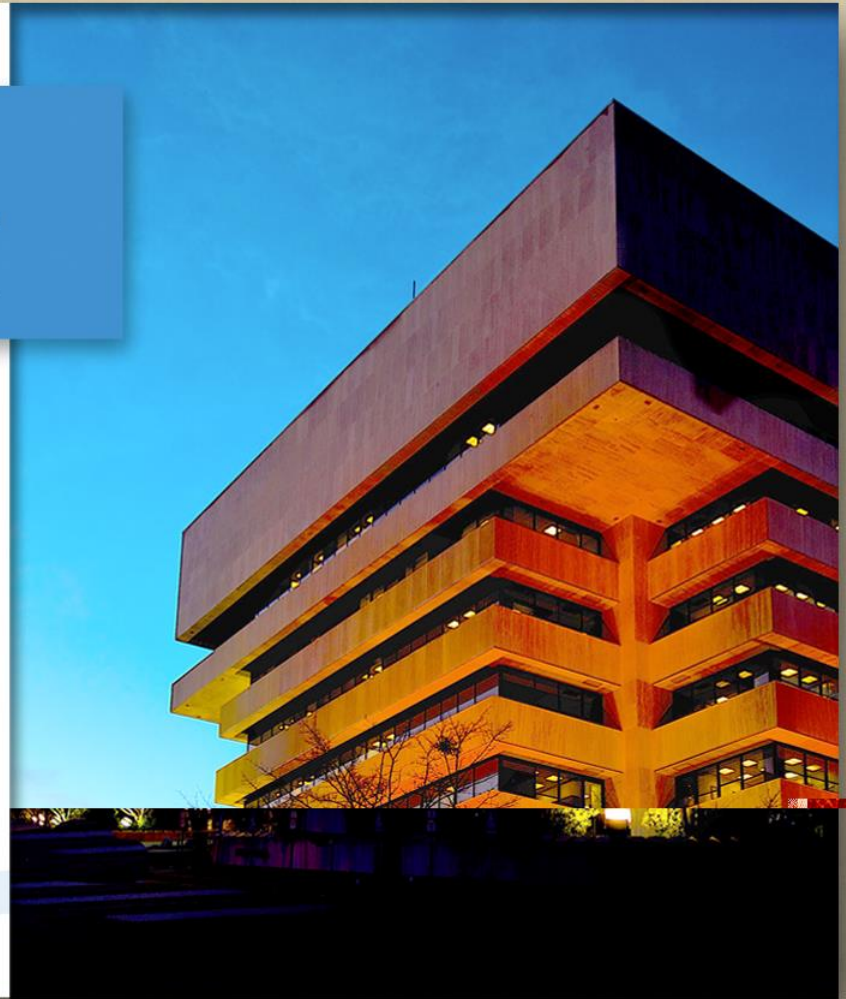

Risk Factors

C.D.C.

Individual Risk Factors

- Deficits in social cognitive or information-processing abilities
- Antisocial beliefs and attitudes
- Exposure to violence and conflict in the family

Family Risk Factors

- Low parental involvement
- Low parental education and income
- Parental substance abuse or criminality

Peer and Social Risk Factors

- Association with delinquent peers
- Social rejection by peers
- Lack of involvement in conventional activities

Community Risk Factors

- Diminished economic opportunities
 - High concentrations of poor residents
 - Low levels of community participation

Protective Factors

C.D.C.


Individual Protective Factors

- Intolerant attitude toward deviance
- Positive social orientation

Family Protective Factors

- Connectedness to family or adults outside the family
- Involvement in social activities

Peer and Social Protective Factors

- Close relationships with non-deviant peers
 - Membership in peer groups that do not condone antisocial behavior
 - Involvement in prosocial activities

Organization	Program Title	Synopsis
Be-Boys and Be-Girls VA Mentor Program	Abu Unity Foundation	Group mentoring that teaches young men and women the importance of respectful interaction with each other. Sessions will cover living skills, etiquette, positive self talk, constructive communication, teamwork, and positive community interaction.
Brothers on the Block, Inc.	I am the Difference Summer Program	Weekly mentoring and support program for males age 14-25 for a 12 week period over the summer. Group sessions, one on one mentoring, field trips and community activities.
Community Builders Network	Summer Leadership Institute for Youth	Internships at community based sites, skill building, and educational field trips
GIRLS Club	My Future Matters	Assist female high school students prepare for post secondary and military entrance exams. Utilize the arts to simulate creative problem solving in difficult areas.

Organization	Program Title	Synopsis
Kevin Swann Enterprises	Money Matters for Teens	Works with rising 9th-12th graders to learn the basic principles of money management, investments, local college trips, application process for scholarships and internships. Parents are engaged to attend sessions and develop spending plans. Mentors will work with students over the course of the year to support them with keeping track of their financial goals.
Lighthouse Outreach	Game Changers	Implementation of the evidence based program Possessing Your Power in the Shell Road, West Hampton and Phoebus neighborhoods. A game bus will visit each neighborhood over an 8 week period and implement an hour of curriculum, 30 minutes of a curriculum DVD, and 30 minutes of video gaming activity. Goal is to reach 100 youth.

MAN Foundation	The BOSS Project (Breaking Obstacles to Seek Success)	<p>Works with youth who have a parent that is currently incarcerated. Participants will be taught proactive measures to avoid youth violence by providing positive experiences. Participants will be able to work on establishing a relationship with the incarcerated parent or express their feelings regarding the effects of the parents incarceration on their life.</p>
My Life My Legacy	My Life My Legacy	<p>Inspire and educate students about post secondary education. College application, scholarship, financial aid, career fairs. Productive activities that build communities and avoid violence.</p>
