ACCESS AGREEMENT

The City of Hampton, Virginia, (hereinafter the CITY) hereby grants the UNITED STATES NAVY, acting by and through the Commanding Officer, Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command, Mid-Atlantic (hereinafter the NAVY), permission to use at no cost the following described real property (hereinafter the PREMISES):

Access to the Mill Creek Pier located behind the Fort Monroe Community Center at 100 Stillwell Road, Fort Monroe, VA 23651 as shown on Exhibit A, for Realistic Military Training (RMT) for the term indicated in Provision 2.

The permission herein granted is subject to the following provisions and conditions:

- 1. FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of the desire to assist the United States of America in its military defense efforts, CITY gives to NAVY the right to access the facilities at no cost to the NAVY. It is mutually agreed that nothing herein shall be construed as a commitment or obligation of funds in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act, 31 U.S.C. 1341 et. Seq.
- 2. This Access Agreement (the Agreement) shall grant above described use for the following term:

15 July 2022 through 14 July 2027

- 3. The PREMISES shall be used by the NAVY on a temporary basis not to exceed a total of sixty (60) days per the term of this Agreement to conduct Realistic Military Training (RMT). In coordination with the CITY, the NAVY shall exercise such control over the above described PREMISES as the NAVY deems necessary. The NAVY shall not be permitted to make any permanent, structural modifications to the PREMISES without the prior written consent of the CITY.
- 4. To the extent allowable under Federal law, and subject to the availability of funds, the NAVY shall endeavor to promptly restore the PREMISES to the same, or as good a condition as existed on the date of entry under this Agreement .except for reasonable wear and tear. The parties agree to complete the Joint Inspection and Inventory Report at Exhibit B within 30 days of execution of this Agreement, which report will reflect the condition of the PREMISES immediately prior to the Navy's RMT activities hereunder. This Agreement does not obligate Navy to expend any appropriated funds. Nothing in this Agreement is intended or should be interpreted to require any obligation or expenditure of funds in violation of the Anti-Deficiency Act (31 U.S.C. § 1342).
- 5. The Navy will be liable for damage to persons or property arising from the negligent actions or inactions of its employees or agents under this agreement in accordance with the procedures and limitations of the Federal Torts Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. §§ 2670–2680.

- 6. The NAVY shall provide the CITY a written request to schedule exercises at the PREMISES at least sixty (60) days prior to the desired date. The NAVY and the CITY shall coordinate to address any scheduling, safety, or related concerns associated with the timing and conducting of the exercises. Pursuant to Section 3 above, the CITY shall either approve or deny the NAVY's written request.


