Annual Action Plan



- Annual Action Plan includes the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Home Investment Partnership (HOME) funds
- Implements the priorities in the 5-Year Consolidated Plan for Housing & Community Development by allocating funding to specific activities that advance the City's housing and community development goals
- Approved by the Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD)



Substantial Amendments



 Budget adjustments that exceed 25% of an activity's budget are considered a substantial amendment to the Annual Action Plan

- Hampton's CDBG & HOME Citizen Participation Plan
 - 30-day public comment period
 - City Council public hearing and approval



Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program



- Primary objective is to develop viable urban communities by providing:
 - Decent housing;
 - A suitable living environment; and
 - Expand economic opportunity.
- Activities must meet one of three national objectives:
 - Benefit low- and moderate-income persons;
 - Aid in the prevention of slums and blight; or
 - Meet an urgent need.

Funds the Weatherization and Energy Efficiency Program (WEEP) and Accessibility Program which assist low- and moderate-income households with energy efficiency and accessibility improvements.



Amendment Rationale



- CDBG funds are no longer used for blighted property acquisition due to strict federal requirements related to property reuse and maintenance costs.
- Capital budget funds support blighted property acquisitions, so no negative impact is expected.
- Remaining CDBG balances from discontinued acquisition and disposition activities will be reallocated to Housing Programs, which directly assist low- and moderate-income households.



Home Investment Partnership Program (HOME)



- Primary objective is to:
 - Expand affordable housing,
 - Strengthen the ability of local governments to provide housing, and
 - Expand the capacity of non-profit community-based housing development organizations.
- Non-Profit Participation: 15% set-aside for certified Community Housing Development Organizations.

Provides down payment and closing cost assistance to low- and moderate-income first-time homebuyers.



Amendment Rationale



- New housing construction and acquisition/rehabilitation activities have been paused due to market conditions and rising construction costs.
- High construction and land acquisition costs make it difficult to build homes that can be sold at prices affordable to income eligible homebuyers.
- Demand has increased for downpayment and closing cost assistance as a result of rising home prices.
- Program funding can be restored in future years if market condition improve and demand for these activities increases.
