

#### <u>Consolidated Annual Performance</u> <u>Evaluation & Report (CAPER)</u>

- 5-Year Consolidated Plan covers Program Years
  2020 2024
- Each year, the City develops and submits an annual budget to HUD in the form of an Annual Action Plan
- The City must submit a CAPER for each current year's Annual Action Plan, FY 2022 for July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023.

#### **Community Development Block Grant Program**

- Primary objective is the development of viable urban communities by providing:
  - Decent housing;
  - A suitable living environment; and
  - Expand economic opportunity.
- Activities must meet one of three national objectives:
  - Benefit low- and moderate-income persons;
  - Aid in the prevention of slums and blight; or
  - Meet an <u>urgent</u> need.

### **HOME Investment Partnership Program**

#### Primary objective is to:

- Increase decent, affordable housing to low and very low income households;
- Expand the capacity of non-profit community based

housing development organizations (CHDO's);

- Strengthen the ability of local governments to provide housing; and
- Leverage private sector participation.
- Non-Profit Participation: 15% CHDO set-aside
