### Introduction (cont.)

 Generally, victims & perpetrators of these crimes are known to one another and/or are involved in illicit activities such as gangs, drugs, & illegal gun use



 Efforts to stop violent crime from occurring in our city require collaboration & partnership across all levels of society: the police department and other local government entities, community and faith-based leaders, schools, and citizens.

# **Update on HPD Gun Task Force**

# **HPD Manning**

- Community Engagement Requires Officer Time
- In December 2016, HPD graduated 17 new officers
- Due to a successful COPS grant, 5 new Police Officer positions have been added, totaling 301 sworn positions
- City Manager has committed to try to fund an additional 7 officers in next year's budget



Goal is to add 5 officers per budget year

# **Advancing Technology**

HPD is researching various technology enhancements focused around surveillance, crime prevention, and suspect apprehension

- Deployment of Smart Phones to Officers

# **Operation Ceasefire / HUB model**

- Comprehensive approach:
  - Prevention
  - Intervention
  - Enforcement
  - Recovery





- HPD is recommending the city adopt a model similar to Operation Ceasefire
  - Successfully implemented in Boston, MA
  - Later deployed to other cities

### Operation Ceasefire / HUB model (cont.)

- <u>Purpose</u>: to intervene & change behavior, one case at a time
  - Accomplished through meetings between LE, Probation/Parole, Judicial, Mental Health, & Employment Officials with criminal offenders
  - Offer employment, mental health, substance abuse, & other services to help them leave the life of crime

### Operation Ceasefire / HUB model (cont.)

 Assemble team of similar individuals to focus on criminal offenders whose past indicates they're more likely to commit future crime

 Assist others who voluntarily seek assistance



# "All Hands on Deck"

 Encourage city employees deployed within the city to actively report suspicious activity

# Other Resources – Hampton Police Gang Unit

- HPD was one of the earliest agencies in the region to address gang crime
  - ID'd the emergence of gangs & dedicated resources to track activity & help alert larger community to signs of gangs
- Unit conducted over 15 presentations to groups such as neighborhood organizations & PTA's in 2016
- History of Cooperative Investigations, Information Sharing and Prevention Efforts

- Established in all City of Hampton middle & high schools
