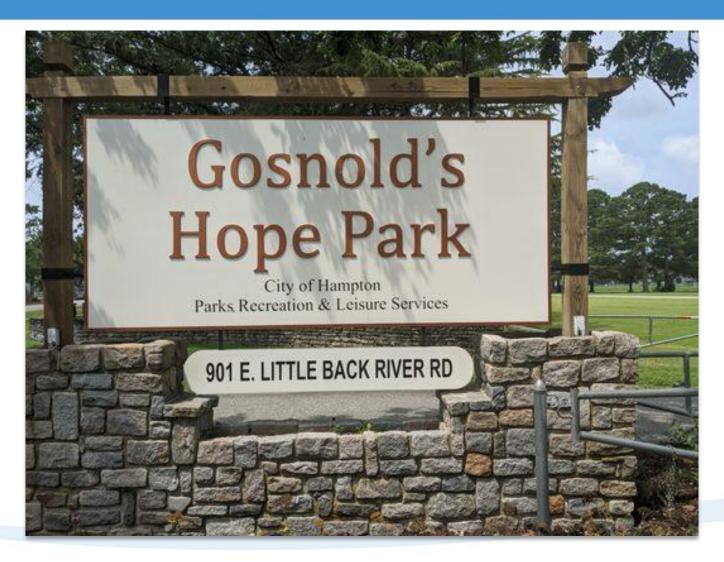

What is National Accreditation

National Accreditation is a formal recognition that a parks and recreation agency meets the highest standards of professionalism, service quality, and operational excellence.

Key Facts:

- Administered by the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA), under NRPA
- Based on compliance with 154 national standards, including:
 - 36 Fundamental Standards (100% required)
 - 106 of 118 Non-Fundamental Standards (90%) for initial accreditation
 - 112 of 118 Non-Fundamental Standards (95%) for reaccreditation
- Less than 1% of agencies nationwide are accredited
- As of 2025, only 214 agencies in the U.S. have earned CAPRA accreditation

What Does National Accreditation Do?

National accreditation helps parks and recreation agencies operate more effectively, serve their communities more equitably, and plan strategically for the future.

It does this by:

- Setting a clear framework for evaluating policies, practices, and services
- Promoting continuous improvement and long-term planning
- Creating consistency in how services are delivered
- Providing external validation of quality and professionalism
- Encouraging transparency and accountability to the public
