Project Description:

This project is the furtherance of an approved 2023 UASI grant initiative, which was awarded in April 2024, to provide terrorism awareness, active assailant response and Stop the Bleed training across all 17 Hampton Roads Planning District localities. The 2023 project provided training events on the southside and Peninsula beginning in June 2024 and will also disseminate approximately 3,000 bleeding control kits to participants and partner agencies. Although a significant undertaking, the 2023 project will fall far short of the level of need in the region. The second phase of the project will build upon initial successes and expand training opportunities for city/county employees, Community Emergency Response Teams, faith-based communities, and other high-risk groups. The proposed 2024 project will further enhance the protection of soft targets and crowded spaces by training participants to recognize and report suspicious behaviors related to terrorist or domestic violent extremist activities; and will further enhance community preparedness and resilience to such activities.

Training will focus on recognizing and responding to suspicious behaviors related to terrorist/criminal acts; preparation and response to active assailants; and post-event acts to mitigate loss of life including bleeding control.</div>
Public Health and Medical Services	Complete Triage and initial stabilization of casualties and begin definitive care for those likely to survive their injuries	<div>Through training and dissemination of appropriate medical supplies, program participants will have the ability to render life-saving aid until first responders can arrive and treat victims of terrorist attacks/mass casualty events. The project seeks to dramatically increase the number of trained and equipped bystanders in the region. Grant funds will be used to purchase supplies needed for hands-on bleeding control training and single victim bleeding control kits for those trained.</div>

Project Sustainability & Scalability

Will this project require sustainment after the grant performance period?	No
What would be accomplished with 75% of requested funding?	The number of training events and amount of training equipment would be reassessed and decreased. However, the planning team would look at economies of scale in an effort to include as much planning and training as feasible to be most effective.
What would be accomplished with 50% of requested funding?	The number of training events and amount of equipment would be reassessed and decreased; in addition, provision of bleeding control kits would be significantly reduced or eliminated. This level of reduction would significantly decrease the ability of the localities, region, and stakeholders to be adequately prepared to respond to an active assailant and/or terrorist event.
What would be accomplished with 25% of requested funding?	The number of training events and the amount of training equipment would be reassessed and decreased and the provision of bleeding control kits would be eliminated. Hampton Roads would have to then seek future funding to continue the planning and training to better prepare their communities to prepare and respond to emergencies and mass casualties.
