

Setting priorities

- Looked at the capital spending in a new way
- Categories aligned with council's strategic priorities
- Asked people to rank their Top 4

Who gave input

- About 250 people
- Most online
- Mostly 35-64
- 73% were white
- All areas represented

Economic Growth: Options

- Buckroe new housing: \$5.2M
- Other master plan redevelopment acquisition: \$2.1M
- Downtown seafood initiative: \$1.7M
- Housing Improvement Fund: \$2.5M
- Infill residential development: \$636K
- Sports tourism facility: \$17M
- Coliseum Drive Extension: \$1.7M (1/2 state)
- Hampton Roads Center infrastructure: \$1.9M
- Mercury Boulevard pedestrian overpass: \$5M

Place Making: Options

- Briarfield Park upgrades: \$8.6M
- Darling Stadium modernization: \$1.3M
- Gosnold's Hope Park upgrades: \$2.7M
- War Memorial improvements: \$8.7M
- 25 meter pool: \$15M
- Streetscaping: \$7.7M
 (9 projects range from \$200K -\$1.7M)
- Sidewalks: \$500K
- Neighborhood grants: \$250K

- Central Park/Dutch Dialogue: \$2M





Safe and Clean: Options

- Replace a fire station: \$9M
- 911/EOC Center: \$12.5M
- GPS vehicle locator: \$300K
- Body-worn/in-car cameras: \$200K
- Shooting range: \$100K
- Blight abatement: \$1.2M



Good Government: Options

- Maintenance of public properties: \$5.8M
- Parks maintenance: \$2M
- Parking lot maintenance: \$1.5M
- Sound walls: \$1M



Education: Options

- 1-1 initiative: \$2M (electronic tablets for students)
- Maintenance: \$2.4M
- Remodeling: \$2.9M
