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(a) If any person without just cause knowingly obstructs a judge, magistrate, justice, juror,
attorney for the commonwealth, witness, any law-enforcement officer, or animal control
officer employed pursuant to the Code of Virginia § 3.2-6555 in the performance of his duties
as such or fails or refuses without just cause to cease such obstruction when requested to do
so by such judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the commonwealth, witness, lawenforcement officer, or animal control officer employed pursuant to the Code of Virginia §
3.2-65505, he shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(b) If any Any person who, by threats, or force, knowingly attempts to intimidate or impede
 a judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the Commonwealth, witness, or any law enforcement officer, or animal control officer employed pursuant to the Code of Virginia §
 3.2-6555 lawfully engaged in his duties as such, or to obstruct or impede the administration
 of justice in any court, he shall be deemed to be is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

(c) Any person who knowingly and willfully makes any materially false statement or
representation to a law-enforcement officer or animal control officer employed pursuant to
the Code of Virginia § 3.2-6555 who is in the course of conducting an investigation of a crime
by another is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

## <sup>34</sup> Sec. 24-7. – Obstructing justice Fleeing from a law-enforcement officer; penalty.

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If any person without just cause knowingly obstructs a judge, magistrate, justice, juror,
 attorney for the commonwealth, witness or any law-enforcement officer in the performance of
 his duties as such or fails or refuses without just cause to cease such obstruction when
 requested to do so by such judge, magistrate, justice, juror, attorney for the commonwealth,
 witness, or law-enforcement officer, he shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.

41 (a) Any person who intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a law-enforcement
42 officer from lawfully arresting him, with our without a warrant, is guilty of a Class 1
43 misdemeanor.

(b) For purposes of this section, intentionally preventing or attempting to prevent a lawful
arrest means fleeing from a law-enforcement officer when (i) the officer applies physical force
to the person, or (ii) the officer communicates to the person that he is under arrest and (a)
the officer has the legal authority and the immediate physical ability to place the person
under arrest, and (b) a reasonable person who receives such communication knows or
should know that he is not free to leave.
