



#### Background


- "Safe & Clean" adopted as the city's effort to have departments collaborate and work intensively in defined areas to address issues of crime and blight.
- City Council adopted ordinances and policies to reduce crime and blight ("broken window theory")

#### Goals of Safe & Clean

- Decrease incidences of violent crimes and serious property crimes
- Reduce blight
- Ensure housing is kept to standards of safety


#### Strategies of Safe & Clean

- Implement new tools for enforcement
- Ensure that all departments are working together
- Establish relationships with neighborhoods
- Build trust and increase communication with police and other city officials, agencies and departments
- Offer city programs and tools for neighborhood improvements





#### Rental Inspections: Goals

- To ensure dwellings meet safe, decent and sanitary living conditions
- Districts defined per state code guidelines



### Rental Inspectors' Activity

- Rental inspectors in the districts conduct:
  - Regular property maintenance inspections
  - City code and zoning violation inspections
  - Inspections when the tenants file complaints through the 311 Call Center
  - Pro-active inspections looking for rental signs, looking at ads for rental property, etc.

#### Rental Inspectors' Activity

- From July 1, 2017 to June 27, 2020:
  - Total rental inspections completed 686
  - Total rental re-inspections completed 1463
  - Total violations 2,063
  - Total first time in rental program 386
  - Total inspections closed 1274
  - 4 year certificates issued 419
  - 1 year certificates issued 12

### Rental Inspection Update

 At the direction of City Council, we have established a team that is currently looking into our current rental inspection process to identify areas where we can be more effective

#### **Hotel Ordinance: Goals**

- Ensure that only hotels with sufficient facilities are used as long-term housing
- Ensure that minors staying in hotels are identified and given access to education
- Find safe and sanitary housing alternatives for those in need

#### **Hotel Ordinance: Results**

- Every motel received their city license last year (24 total)
- 5 motels approved for extended stays
- 100% of extension applications received from residents in motels approaching 30 day stays were screened and assessed for homeless services

#### PM & ZE Totals Last PY

- Total Inspections: 22,524
- Total Violations: 23,126
  - High Grass: 8,134
  - Debris: 1,869
  - Inoperable Vehicle: 6,788
  - Property Maintenance: 4,858

#### **General Code Violations**

- We cannot enforce based upon aesthetics, including:
  - Different siding colors
  - Different paint colors
  - Mismatched roof shingles
  - Structures that are covered in algae/dirt on the outside (need to be power washed)
  - Clutter
- Many of these items give an appearance of blight but are not regulated by State Code as they do not address safety or deterioration.



### **New Legislative Authority**


- In the last General Assembly Session localities were granted greater authority to regulate some issues of blight














## Safe & Clean Part-I Property Offenses Burglary, Larceny & Motor Vehicle Theft








