


## **Hampton Public Works**

## **Engineering Services Division**

Our Engineering Services Division manages all capital improvement projects for the City of Hampton to include:

- Improving waterways
- Stormwater improvements to reduce flooding
- Renovations and repairs of city buildings
- Virginia Department of Transportation Programs (VDOT)
  - New infrastructure
  - Intersection improvements
  - Multi-use paths
  - Roadway safety improvements
  - Road extensions

## **VDOT Projects**

- Engineering managed 4 SGR projects in FY20; two on Armistead Ave., one on Mercury Blvd. and one on Magruder Blvd.
- VDOT & CSX Railroad Signal Upgrade
- Citywide Flashing Yellow Installing flashing yellow left turn arrows on various intersections throughout the entire city.
- Upcoming VDOT Projects: SMART SCALE Applications
  - Coliseum Drive Extension Phase B: Consistent with the Coliseum Central Master Plan, this project will continue the northern extension of Coliseum Drive by building a new 4-lane divided roadway and shared-use path from Butler Farm Road to Magruder Blvd to connect the Coliseum Central area to Hampton Roads Center North. This project will also provide relief for the proposed closure of Armistead Ave adjacent to Langley Air Force Base.
  - In North Campus Parkway Bicycle & Pedestrian Improvements: This project will install a shared-use path south of Commander Shepard Boulevard to connect to the Matteson Trail and eventually to the Coliseum Central area (via the proposed Coliseum Drive Extension). This project will also install missing sidewalk sections north of Commander Shepard Boulevard, along North Campus Parkway and Floyd Thompson Drive.
  - □ North King Street Corridor Improvements Segment 5: Consistent with the North King Street Master Plan, this project will install the last segment of a continuous shared-use path between Downtown and the Langley Air Force Base gate. This project will improve safety and provide access to the existing bus stops along the east side of North King Street.

- Pembroke Avenue Phase III Reconstruction of curb and gutter, sidewalks, crosswalks and lighting to increase user safety.





Fleet is an internal service that serves all city departments and several boards and organizations. They manage vehicle maintenance and repairs, acquisitions, disposals, rentals and provide 24 hour fueling.

### **Completed Services**

- 3,635 repair work orders
- 2,012 preventative maintenance work orders
- 162 road side assistance calls
- City Used 440,665 gallons of unleaded fuel
- City Used 628,140 gallons of diesel fuel
- Processed 46 pieces of equipment for replacement
- Processed 43 pieces of equipment for disposal

## Solid Waste & The Steam Plant

Provides waste collection and disposal to all residential customers in

Hampton to include:

- Weekly refuse
- Weekly bulk
- Bi-weekly recycling



• Yard waste drop off site at the landfill six days a week

The Steam Plant converts the waste to energy in order to produce steam that powers NASA and reduces the waste sent to the landfill.



## **Environmental Impact**



We collected 127,869 tons



#### We completed 17,340 requests



Processed 68,000 tons of refuse

### **COVID-19 & Solid Waste**



- Solid Waste bulk collections saw an average of 23% increase over the first 4 months.
- Over 2,000 tons more taken to the Landfill from February to May 2020 v/s 2019.

## **Streets & Bridges**

#### Maintains and repairs all City owned:

- Streets
- Bridges
- Sidewalks
- Curb and Gutters
- City owned parking lots



Provides monthly street sweeping services, conduct emergency pothole repairs, and inspections of public infrastructure for:

- Capital improvement projects
- Site and subdivision development
- Permitted right-of-way activity

## **Street & Bridge Maintenance**



49,685 tons of asphalt resurfacing



524 LF of curb & gutter 3,659 LF of sidewalk



### Construction Projects & Inspection Services

Managed 57 construction projects within the city providing inspection services



Performed 3,600 right-of-way inspections

## List of Projects

- Placed 49,685 tons of asphalt on roadways
- Repaired / replaced 524 linear feet of curb and gutter
- Repaired / installed 3,659 linear feet of sidewalk
- Managed 57 construction projects
- Inspected all City maintained bridges
- Provided street sweeping services for all city-maintained streets and removed 4,369 tons of debris
- Performed 3,600 right-of-way inspections
- Patched 2,730 residential potholes
- Responded to 1,851 citizen requests



## Wastewater

Maintains the city's sanitary sewer system to include:

- 40 miles of pressure pipe
- 420 miles of gravity pipe
- 11,000 manholes
- 48,000 service connections
- 109 Pump stations

## **Stormwater: Living with Water**

Implements environmentally sound practices including the maintenance of stormwater pipes, structures, open ditches, and outfalls in order to:

- Protect the environment
- Reduce flooding to protect people and property
- Support healthy waterways
- Create a healthier and more sustainable community

- Managed all capital improvement projects for the city and completed 12 capital projects and 4 additional projects are in the final stages of completion
- Responded to over 22,000 citizen requests
- Completed over 40 major Plumbing, HVAC, and Electrical Building
  Improvements
- Assisted additional departments including Parks & Leisure Service, Hampton City Schools, Emergency Management and the Hampton Police department
- Completed the extension of the Waste to Energy Agreement with NASA for the Hampton Steam Plant
