1 Ordinance to Amend and Re-Enact the Zoning Ordinance of the City Of Hampton, Virginia 2 by Amending Chapter 2 Entitled "Definitions" Pertaining to Vehicle Use Definitions 3 4 WHEREAS, the public necessity, convenience, general welfare and good zoning practice so 5 require; 6 7 BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Hampton, Virginia that Section 2-2 of Chapter 8 2 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Hampton, Virginia be amended to read as follows: 9 10 Section 2-2. – Definitions 11 12 Vehicle sales, new vehicle inventory lot. In conjunction with new vehicle sales, any premises or 13 space exposed to the weather used for the storage of new vehicles, boats, and recreational 14 vehicles. 15 16 Salvage or wrecking. The dismantling or wrecking of used motor vehicles or trailers, or the storage, 17 sale of dismantled, partially dismantled, damaged vehicles or their parts. This term shall include 18 auto recycler, demolisher, salvage dealer, salvage pool, and vehicle removal operator as defined by 19 Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended 20 21 Scrap metal processor. Any establishment who acquires one or more whole vehicles to process into 22 scrap for remelting purposes who, from a fixed location, utilizes machinery and equipment for 23 processing and manufacturing ferrous and nonferrous metallic scrap into prepared grades, and 24 whose principal product is metallic scrap, as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, 25 as amended. 26 27 28 29 Service station. Any structure, enclosure or premises used for the repairing and servicing of motor 30 vehicles when outdoor vehicle storage is restricted to designated paved parking spaces and limited 31 to sixty (60) days for vehicles not used in the operation of the station. 32 ... 33 Vehicle repair, heavy. Repair shops whose work requires dismantling pieces of a vehicle for repair. 34 Typical services may include light vehicle repair, collision repair; engine or transmission work 35 requiring removal and/or replacement of all or part of the engine or transmission; and replacement of 36 items such as doors and bumpers. Such work often takes days or weeks to complete. This term 37 shall include rebuilder as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended. 38 39 Vehicle repair, light. Repair shops whose work is routine to vehicle maintenance and does not 40 require dismantling pieces of a vehicle. Typical services may include oil change, tire repair, rotation, 41 or replacement; and glass repair or replacement. Such work often takes only hours to complete. 42 43 Vehicle storage area. Any premises or space exposed to the weather used for the storage of towed, 44 abandoned, or damaged vehicles for up to sixty (60) days. 45 46 Vehicle storage, indoor. Any premises used for the storage of vehicles or their parts within a wholly 47 enclosed building, which shall not include any outdoor storage of vehicles or their parts. This term 48 may include vehicle removal operator indoors only as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of 49 Virginia, as amended. This term shall not include outdoor new car inventory storage area, or 50 salvage or wrecking as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended. 51

Vehicle storage, outdoor. Any premises or space exposed to the weather used for the storage of non-damaged vehicles, but not their parts. If vehicles are stored on site, this term shall not include vehicle removal operator as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, or salvage or wrecking as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.
