

City Code Amendment

Staff reviewed city code requirements, as well as current interpretations, related to vehicle uses in order to determine where they could be strengthened and/or clarified

Proposed Residential Inoperable Vehicle Changes

Definitions:

- <u>Residential zoned property</u> applies to all lots with one-family, two-family, or a duplex dwelling as the primary use.
- <u>Owner</u> means the owner of the vehicle or, if the owner of the vehicle cannot be ascertained, the owner of the premises.

Current Commercial Inoperable Vehicle Code

- All commercial properties are permitted to have up to five unscreened inoperable vehicles
- Initial time to correct violation: 60 days
- Prior interpretations have allowed:
 - Auto sales to have an unlimited number of inoperable vehicles
 - Auto dealer, salvage dealer and scrap processor establishments, which have been in business since 1970, to have an unlimited number of inoperable vehicles

Proposed Commercial Inoperable Vehicle Code

- Only commercial properties licensed in heavy vehicle repair will be able to have unscreened inoperable vehicles (no more than 5)
- Initial time to correct violation: 10 days
- More strictly interpret state code exemptions
 - Only required to exempt licensed businesses which on June 26, 1970, were engaged in business as an automobile dealer, salvage dealer, or scrap processor

Enforcement

- Inspector finds that a violation of the City Code Section 24-39 or 24-39.1 exists
- Owner of record would receive a notice of violation
- If violation is not corrected within the specified time period of 10 calendar days:
 - Inspector can request a summons for court; or
 - Send City tow contractor to remove the vehicle/s from the property

Zoning Ordinance Amendment

- Clarify vehicle related uses
- Align with DMV
- Added oversight for some vehicle related uses

New Definitions

- Vehicle sales, new vehicle inventory lot
 - In conjunction with new vehicle sales, any premises or space exposed to the weather used for the storage of new vehicles, boats, and recreational vehicles
- Scrap metal processor
 - Any establishment who acquires one or more whole vehicles to process into scrap for remelting purposes who, from a fixed location, utilizes machinery and equipment for processing and manufacturing ferrous and nonferrous metallic scrap into prepared grades, and whose principal product is metallic scrap, as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

New Definitions

• Vehicle repair, light.

 Repair shops whose work is routine to vehicle maintenance and does not require dismantling pieces of a vehicle.
 Typical services may include oil change, tire repair, rotation, or replacement; and glass repair or replacement. Such work often takes only hours to complete.

• Vehicle repair, heavy.

– Repair shops whose work requires dismantling pieces of a vehicle for repair. Typical services may include light vehicle repair, collision repair; engine or transmission work requiring removal and/or replacement of all or part of the engine or transmission; and replacement of items such as doors and bumpers. Such work often takes days or weeks to complete. This term shall include rebuilder as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

New Definitions

• Vehicle storage, indoor.

– Any premises used for the storage of vehicles or their parts within a wholly enclosed building, which shall not include any outdoor storage of vehicles or their parts. This term may include vehicle removal operator indoors only as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended. This term shall not include outdoor new car inventory storage area, or salvage or wrecking as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

Vehicle storage, outdoor.

Any premises or space exposed to the weather used for the storage of non-damaged vehicles, but not their parts. If vehicles are stored on site, this term shall not include vehicle removal operator as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, or salvage or wrecking as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

Updated Definition

• Salvage or wrecking.

 The dismantling or wrecking of used motor vehicles or trailers, or the storage, sale of dismantled, partially dismantled, damaged vehicles or their parts. This term shall include auto recycler, demolisher, salvage dealer, salvage pool, and vehicle removal operator as defined by Section 46.2-1600 of the Code of Virginia, as amended
