Briefing on the Poverty Study & Family Resilience and Economic Empowerment

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

The briefing will provide an update on the City Council's strategic priority of Family Resilience and Economic Empowerment. The briefing will consist of three presentations. The first presentation will be presented by MGT Consulting and will detail the findings of their poverty study. The poverty study will be utilized to inform the work plan in this strategic priority area.
